Water Safety Tips

- Swim in designated areas supervised by lifeguards.
- Always swim with a buddy; do not allow anyone to swim alone. Even at a public pool or a lifeguarded beach, use the buddy system!
- Never leave a young child unattended near water and do not trust a child's life to another child; teach children to always ask permission to go near water.
- Avoid alcohol use. Alcohol impairs judgment, balance and coordination; affects swimming and diving skills; and reduces the body's ability to stay warm.
- Establish rules for your family and enforce them without fail. For example, set limits based on each person's ability, do not let anyone play around drains and suction fittings, and do not allow swimmers to hyperventilate before swimming under water or have breath-holding contests.
- Enroll in Red Cross home pool safety, water safety, first aid and CPR/
 AED courses to learn how to prevent and respond to emergencies.

Freeport Road Closure from June 1 to September 15, 2015

Waterline replacement to get underway on Freeport Boulevard from Meadowview Road to Cosumnes River Boulevard (CRB) Interchange

As part of the Cosumnes River Boulevard Extension Project and to support the Delta Shores development adjacent to the project, the City will begin replacement of a new waterline on Freeport Boulevard on June 1, 2015.

Construction is slated to last approximately three months and be complete by September 15, 2015. During this time, Freeport Boulevard will be closed to through traffic from Meadowview Road to the new Cosumnes River Boulevard (CRB) interchange.

To minimize inconvenience and allow access to all driveways as well as the <u>Bill Conlin Youth Sports Complex</u> and dog park within the project area, the work will be performed in three stages. Local traffic will be able to access properties by utilizing the driving instructions found on the attached closure map.

The newly completed CRB interchange was opened to the traveling public on May 4. The interchange allows access to the area for both local traffic and the Delta Shores Development, while work continues on the waterline extension and the CRB roadway extension to Franklin Boulevard. The entire project is expected to be complete and open to the public by fall 2015.

The project will improve east-west mobility for motorists and bicyclists, reduce traffic congestion along Mack Road and promote economic development by creating new access to 800 vacant acres of the Delta Shores development site.

The City Clerk's Office is a Passport Acceptance Facility through the U.S. Department of State. Applying for your passport is as simple as scheduling an appointment and bringing the following items with you to your appointment:

- Completed application (NOT signed), available in person at the City Clerk's Office or via the U.S. Department of State's website
- Evidence of U.S. Citizenship, such as U.S. birth certificate (original or certified copy), naturalization certificate or previous passport
- Valid Photo Identification
- Passport photo, available for a fee at the City Clerk's Office or at stores such as Costco, Walgreens and Rite Aid
- Payment for fees due (fees are dependent on services needed)
 - One payment is due to the U.S. Department of State (must be CHECK or MONEY ORDER) and one payment is due to the City of Sacramento, payable by cash, check, or credit.



Exhibitions, Events, and Programs at the Crocker Art Museum

CONTINUING EXHIBITIONS

"David Ligare: California Classicist" June 7 through September 20, 2015

A self-proclaimed Classicist, David Ligare (born 1945) creates perfectly ordered still-life, landscape, architectural, and figurative paintings that occupy their own poetic world. The complete range of his subject matter is represented here in this retrospective exhibition of nearly 80 works. Although often grouped with California's Photorealists, the very unreality of Ligare's paintings and his underlying interest in antiquity belie such a label, and the perfection of his unblemished subjects and hyper-purity of his paint application seem more unearthly than real. In achieving these qualities, Ligare looks to the ancients for guidance and references the formal relationships found in Classical sculpture and architecture. And yet his paintings are firmly based in the specifics of California—and the Monterey region in particular, allowing Ligare to create art that is richly layered, broadly universal, and yet specifically of our time and place.

"Flowers of Fire and Earth: Shimo's Blue-and-White Porcelains" June 21 through September 6, 2015

If ever there were a perfect match between an artist's medium and subject matter, it is in Shimo's blue-and-white porcelains decorated with lotus flowers. An iconic symbol in Buddhism, the lotus springs forth pristinely white from the bottom of the murky pond in which it grows, suggesting the holiness of the Buddhist doctrine and the purity of the devotee. The same is true of the porcelain itself, which comes from a dwindling deposit in Jingdezhen, in Shimo's native China. Beautifully translucent, it is the perfect ground for representing not only the lotus and others types of flowers, but landscapes and figures, all unions of history and modernity, East and West. In the approximately 40 works included in the exhibition, blue-and-white decoration encircles modernist forms, and bold, non-representational passages blend with recognizable motifs. Shimo has often said that he aims to "combine ancient traditions with a contemporary spirit" and, in a metaphor appropriate to his porcelains, "to melt the national aesthetics of Eastern and Western art in one furnace."

"Armin Hansen: The Artful Voyage" June 28 through October 11, 2015

Armin Hansen (1886–1957) sought to capture the raw power and vitality of the Pacific and those who sailed it, rather than the beauty of the ocean's light and color for its own sake. Although the San Francisco native at times painted lush still lifes, spirited rodeo scenes, and loosely rendered landscapes, his signature subjects were fisherfolk and the sea. Often described as an Impressionist, Hansen's art departed from the calm and colorful beauty that characterized the style, even though he used bold colors and, at times, broken brushstrokes. For the most part, Hansen rejected Impressionism's gentility to focus on humanity's interaction and contests with nature. He did so with broad masses of color, dynamic compositions, and the elimination of superfluous detail. At heart a storyteller, he had an ability to create compelling narratives. His stories are told here through some 100 works, including oils on canvas, watercolors, and etchings. The exhibition is organized by the Pasadena Museum of California Art in collaboration with the staff of the Crocker Art Museum.

"Camellia Waldorf School: The Art of Learning" July 2 through December 6, 2015

At Camellia Waldorf School, the arts are infused into all subjects at every grade level, from preschool through eighth grade. Camellia Waldorf students work throughout their education with color and form; with clay, wood, fiber, metal, charcoal, and ink; with tone, drama, and speech; and with eurythmy as an art of bodily movement. For 25 years, Camellia Waldorf School's academically rigorous and developmentally appropriate approach has nurtured creativity and resilience, strengthening students' ability to think critically, collaborate, and communicate. Students graduate as independent thinkers, becoming leaders who impact the community and the world in positive ways. Located in south Sacramento, Camellia Waldorf School is uniquely distinguished as the most diverse Waldorf school in North America. The objects on view represent work by students from age 6 to 14. The exhibition reception will take place on Sunday, December 6, at 1 PM.





Human trafficking is modern day slavery. According to the United States Government, "human trafficking" refers to the act of recruiting, harboring, transporting, providing, or obtaining a person for compelled labor or commercial



sex acts through the use of force, fraud, or coercion. In other words, it is the process of controlling a person with the intent to exploit them. While the term "trafficking" might imply some kind of movement, victims of human trafficking can be born into slavery or otherwise enslaved without having been transported anywhere

It is estimated that there are 35.8 million slaves in the world today. They are women. They are men. They are children. Modern day slaves can be found all over the world, including in every state in the U.S. In fact, it is also estimated that there are up to 300,000 children at risk of being trafficked in the United States alone.
